### Advent...

Advent marks the beginning of the church's year. It usually begins on the last Sunday in November, although this year it starts on the first Sunday in December and encompasses four Sundays which takes us up to Christmas Eve.


It is known as a time for preparation, a reflection in darkness (in the Northern Hemisphere, our winter season gives us longer, darker nights and shorter days). It is a time for renewal of hope and expectation, as we move towards a new beginning as we celebrate again the birth of Jesus Christ, fully man and fully God, into our world. The lighting of candles on an Advent wreath was imported into Britain from northern Europe in the nineteenth century and is now a common practice. One candle is lit each Sunday, until on the fourth Sunday when all are ablaze with light. The candles symbolise the coming of the light into the world.



Advent is a time to take stock of who we are and where we are, particularly in our faith journey. It offers us the opportunity of a new beginning, a chance to transform ourselves from that old person who lived in darkness to a new person who lives in the light and love of God.

This Advent season let us embrace the time and challenge ourselves to review what we do, to discard those things which are not pleasing to God and to welcome new ways of showing Christ to a dark world. As Mothers' Union, our theme for the year is Transformation Now, so let us reconsider our faith in action over Advent and transform our 'doing a little' to 'doing more' in 2024.

### **Peterborough Deanery Project**

On June 1<sup>st</sup> members from the Peterborough Deanery took 20 discharge bags, hand made by members, containing toiletries hand towels and flannels to HMP Peterborough.

These were gratefully received by Bev Stevens Custodial Policy Lead for the Women's Prison, and Chancie the manager of the Women's and baby unit. This was the first delivery of the bags and also wool, children's toys and games and much needed hygiene items to the unit.

Our Deanery project this year is to support the unit and members willingly donated items to go into the bags, and we also had a specific fundraising week where all proceeds would go to support our project.

Branch Leaders and our VP Kay Short had much enjoyment filling the first 10 bags at our Deanery meeting. The bags will be given to the women on discharge, the toys have already been examined and gone to the family room for visiting day and the wool taken to the unit for the women to start making items.

We are waiting for clearance of some members who have volunteered to visit the prison and help with crafting, knitting, listening and hopefully teach basic cooking skills.

We will review the outcome of the bags in September, but we are hoping this will be an ongoing project and look forward to serving the Lord and Promoting MU through this ministry. We welcome your prayer support as we step forward in faith.

# Spotlight on Brackley Deanery



Brackley Deanery used to have several village branches but now the only branch is at St Peter's.

St Peter's Church is situated in the old town area of Brackley, which is in the southern-most part of the Diocese. In 2023 the church is celebrating its 800-year anniversary since the first known vicar although the church dates to the Norman era.

There has been a Mothers' Union branch at St Peter's for many decades and our membership is in the range of thirty. We meet ten times a year, with our March meeting being our AGM, and after the business meeting we move from the church to the church extension for an on-site cooked lunch which is prepared by one of our members.

Our other nine meetings consist of speakers and activities as varied as possible and are open to non-members as well. This is also the case at our monthly communion service held on the first Tuesday of the month.

We try to take part in as many events as possible but with an aging membership who are not mobile it does limit our scope. We used to have a dedicated "Teddy" knitting circle until legislation took that away. We do have knitters producing other items. We also fund raise for the church and this year managed to supply new Bibles for baptism candidates something we intend to continue with.

We are very lucky to have a supportive Vicar who knew nothing about the organisation until he joined our church in 2019.
