After a light lunch off we went. Mumu was registered and fitted with a harness. We watched her whizz down and land safely. Mumu then received her certificate of Bravery.


She then came home and went for a well-earned rest in her basket.

100 and Not Out!



The latest batch delivered to Africa in August, care of Phoenix Resources, was 27 blankets, bringing their total to 100 blankets completed since Spring 2022.

Pamela and her friends will continue the good work, and who knows they may reach 150 in 2026 in honour of Mothers' Union's 150th birthday.

Well done to Helmdon village and thank you for taking Mothers' Union projects to heart.
